Reflections and Insights

SA Council of Churches, together with more than 80 local and national church/ecumenical leaders, welcomed Rev Dr Olav Fykse Tveit, General Secretary, World Council of Churches, to SA on Friday 14 October 2016, for a day of prayer, friendship, conversation and learning.

We were hosted by St Mary and Anba Bishoy Coptic Orthodox Church who extended generous and gracious hospitality in many ways.

In the morning presentation, Dr Tveit referred to his most recent book 'The Truth We Owe Each Other: *Mutual Accountability in the Ecumenical Movement*', and described the importance of the commitment of member churches to their ecumenical council as a place of gathering for conversation, action and growing more fully into their unity in Christ.

He also referred to reception of **Baptism Eucharist and Ministry** (Faith and Order Paper no. 111, the "Lima Text"): 15 January 1982. This famous text, adopted by Faith and Order at its plenary commission meeting in Lima, Peru in 1982, explores the growing agreement - and remaining differences - in fundamental areas of the churches' faith and life. The most widely-distributed and studied ecumenical document, BEM has been a basis for many "mutual recognition" agreements among churches and remains a reference today.

Question: [from SA Council of Churches] In what ways do you and your Church demonstrate mutual accountability to your ecumenical others?

Question: [from SA Council of Churches] What areas of life and mission have your Church affirmed, recognised or committed to with another? What more can your church do by way of affirmation, recognition or commitment?

People gathered in the courtyard for lunch, and the WCC team met at a long table over lunch with church/ecumenical council leaders from SA, other States and nationally. [*List of participants, see 'A' p3*]. All catering was prepared, provided and served by the Coptic Orthodox community – thank you!

In the afternoon, we gathered for a Panel Conversation, entitled 'Healing our Broken Life: *Living More Fully our Love and Unity in Christ - in, with, and for our world*', with Dr Tveit and SA Church Leaders - Bishop Suriel [Coptic Orthodox], Bishop Tim Harris [Anglican], Dr Deidre Palmer [Uniting], and Archbishop Philip Wilson [Roman Catholic]. Preparation for this session is as described at 'B' on page 3.



Insights offered included Peace, including across the Middle East; Day of prayer and fasting; Young people: gathering for shared ecumenical experience; Women's role in the church; Role of scripture. Some of these will be developed further.

There were media Interviews and photos taken, including Jade Gailberger *The Advertiser*, Jenny Brinkworth, Director, Catholic Communications/ Editor, *The Southern Cross*.

The day concluded with thanks, and closing prayer, led by Jill Gallio, President of SA Council of Churches

As the WCC visitors made their way back to the airport, in the care of the Coptic Orthodox drivers, people were invited to visit the Coptic Gallery of SA, which describes in various ways the culture of Ancient Egypt and of Coptic Egypt.

or

A girl who was dying, or a woman who is haemorrhaging, or who is crippled;

or

A withered hand, a lamp in a cellar, an unclean cup or a barren fig tree.

- b) What gift might your church/ the ecumenical movement through WCC seek from your 'ecumenical other' that may lead to healing and to living more fully our love and unity in Christ?
